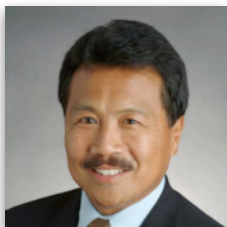
## Session Overview

It is the mission of both APSEA and ACSED to ensure equal opportunity and to advance the careers of members. Prop. 16 has potential implications on equal opportunity within California.

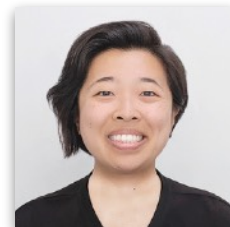
This event is dedicated to exploring current trends within the sphere of equal employment opportunity, and will examine the latest data related to diversity in public sector employment.

Presenters will then explain both what a “yes” and “no” vote on Prop. 16 means.

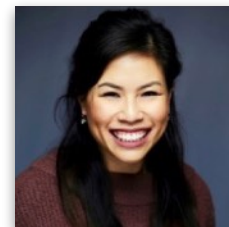
